#### **RUTLAND REGIONAL ALERTS**

Rutland Regional Alerts, powered by Smart911 is the official emergency notification system used by the Towns of Barre, Hubbardston, Oakham, Rutland, and Warren to communicate with community residents during emergencies. Sign up now to receive free alerts from your community officials via text message, email, and/or voice message. Registration can be done here: https://www.rrecc.us/alerts

In addition to emergency alerts, you can also choose to receive customizable community notifications. These include notifications about severe weather, safety, health, utility disruptions, major traffic incidents, and more. This service is provided by the Rutland RECC at no cost to the public; though message and data rates may apply.

Add your address to receive geo-targeted alerts. Indicate what types of alerts you want to receive including weather, traffic, emergency, and more. Indicate how you want to be notified by text, email, and/or voice message.

# April 17: "The Odd Life of Timothy Green" (rated PG)



The Odd Life of Timothy Green is а 2012 American fantasy film directed by Hedges and written by Hedges and Ahmet Zappa (another son of Frank). The film stars Jennifer Garner, Joel Edgerton, C.J. Adams, Dianne Wiest, and the wonderful M. Emmet Walsh, just recently deceased. The film tells the story of a couple

who bury a box in their backyard containing all their wishes for a child, and a young boy named Timothy mysteriously appears at their door the next day.

The acting gets consistently favorable reviews, including this from Roger Ebert, who says the film is

"accessible to all but the youngest children, and I suspect their parents will enjoy it, too. It respects the integrity of its story by dealing with real emotions of loss and parting. It's intelligently constructed by writer-director Peter Hedges (who wrote "What's Eating Gilbert Grape" and "About a Boy"); instead of being simpleminded like too many family films, it treats the characters with care and concern."
